OBJECTIVES: Critically appraise latest evidence regarding care for older adults. Learn about wound healing in young/healthy and as we age, with methods to promote healing of senescent ulcers. Understand negative health outcomes for victims of financial exploitation and how to avoid being a victim. Understand the DICE approach for assessment/evaluating behavior symptoms in dementia and learn when behavioral and pharmacological interventions are indicated. Identify areas for collaboration with clinical pharmacists and health professionals in deprescribing. Learn about training whole clinics in primary palliative care skills and approach, advanced care planning, and developing champions with additional skills of care conversations/symptom management. Learn skincare considerations of aging skin and diagnosis/treatment of dermatologic diseases in older adults. Learn psychosocial and nutritional impact of modified texture diet on people with dysphagia and describe rationale and evidence behind transitional food use in older adults and potential therapeutic benefits. Learn how to treat diabetes in the same patient in different health care settings.
